- In Sept, after over two years of negotiations, the township closed on property on the West End (see enclosed article) which will now allow a park area and dock/lauch site for future generations.



Airport Improvements

The much awaited SRE building (Snow Removal Equipment) is finally completed just in time for another winter season for Bois Blanc Airport. Once the ferry stops running, the airport is our lifeline for the mainland. Any transportation for doctors, mail, groceries or emergencies is dependent on our airport being ready and clear for The Western Star used to plow the runway was purchased in 20??, but we had no building large enough to actually house it. Working on it, if necessary, was difficult as you were always exposed to the weather. Well, this year the 2 old hangers closest to the runway were removed and the new building large enough to house the plow and the future planned snow blower was built in the clearing

Let's talk trash!

If you haven't already heard, there is a new transfer station program this year. A review of the last 3 years costs for trash removal prompted the township board, with the help of the transfer station manager to look at the way we had been handling garbage services and alternatives. For 2019 we shifted to a township bag program. The township bags are printed and light green in color, making it clearly defined for the station attendants. Bags are 1.5 mil in thickness and 33 gallons in capacity. The free truckload program was eliminated, but we allowed each taxpayer 10 free bags (that could be picked up at the township hall). Cost for the township bags are \$3. Should you choose to use your own bags of the same size, it is \$4. Any oversized bags will be billed accordingly by the transfer station attendant.

Going to the township bags ensures consistency in size and a fair distribution of charges. Those using the transfer station for disposal of large and small household items can still do so at the rates posted. The township board is considering other ways to be more efficient in the future including the possibility of a trash compaction system. For the items that our transfer station cannot take, we have a list of possible sources for disposal on the mainland available on the website and at the township hall.

Township Purchases 3.5 acres of West End Property

For many years now the residents and visitors of Bois Blanc Island have enjoyed the western most point of the island for viewing the bridge at night, the fireworks on the 4th of July and summer sunsets. A few years ago this property was sold, and even though the Douglas and Van Horn families have been extremely gracious and accommodating to the community, they had plans for a home on that property. After 2 years of negotiations, we were finally able to close on a piece of that property that will allow all parties to move forward. The purchase allowed the township and citizens some legal clarification on easements and access to roads in that area. It includes the site of the old dock that was utilized to ship logs off the island in the past and will allow us to work with Engineers and DNR/DEQ/USACE in the future to put in a day use pier and landing place for emergency access/evacuation. We have had to utilize Mackinac Marine Rescue in the past, and when doing so they need to meet our rescue vehicle at the marina on the south side of the island. A pick up here on the west end could save 45 minutes in getting someone to treatment. That can be life saving! This land will also accommodate a park where people can have access to the water and still view the bridge or fireworks. There are currently temporary plans to be developed further to allow for raised nonintrusive wetlands viewing walkways and perhaps a gazebo for bird watching/wildlife viewing or just peaceful meditation. Development is viewed as being in phases. The first will be the infrastructure of a road for access to the lake, and a pier or place for emergency boats to land. Right now, we ask that you please patiently await the development and respect the private property owners on both sides.
